"Do not despise these small beginnings, for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin."

Zechariah 4:10a

As I write this the beauty of spring is just beginning. Tulips and daffodils, the first to emerge each spring, reach for the sun. The trees are beginning to bud. The grass is lush and green. As this is our first spring in Easton, each plant and flower that emerges in our yard is a surprise and a joy. It seems that every day we notice a new plant and we ask each other: I wonder what that will be?

Yet the beginning of spring, if taken at face value, can be a little underwhelming. Tiny green things poking up from the ground are not all that impressive. They are small. They are vulnerable to frost and hungry deer. They aren't much to look at.

But we all know that these little shoots signify something greater, something far beyond themselves-- they signify spring! And so when we see green things appearing on the bushes and in the ground we see not just what they ARE but what they WILL be. The unassuming buds are just the beginning. They represent the coming beauty and the warmer weather.

I want to challenge this church to 'not despise small beginnings.' But rather to rejoice with the Lord that the work of his gospel has begun in this new season.

Rejoicing in the work that has begun means that we must take the time to notice the small buds and the glimmers of new life in our congregation. But it also means that we must rejoice in the *PROCESS* of new life and health. Being frustrated that a bud is still a bud doesn't make it bloom any faster. As we emerge from covid in the coming months (with new pastors) we must rejoice in the process that is before us--a process of transformation. For many, things will move too slow and for others too fast but we can be united around this challenge to not despise small beginnings because the LORD rejoices to see the work.

These glimmers of new life that we see should be celebrated because of what they are now but also because of what they point to and what they represent: the gospel of Jesus working through us to further his kingdom.

He who began a good work in Covenant Congregational Church* will be faithful to complete it. Philippians 1:6

Special Confirmation Worship Service on May 23rd

The Confirmation Class of 2020/2021 will be celebrating Confirmation Sunday on May 23 at 10:30am. Eight amazing students will be confirmed as they share their faith testimonies, and lead portions of the worship service.

Please make your reservations early for Confirmation Sunday. The service will be live streamed as well.

Confirmation is a yearlong faith journey of studying the Bible and learning about Jesus' incredible life, His sacrifices, and His deep love and promises to us. This year's class of 8 students (7 boys and 1 girl) met on Sunday evenings from September through May, and participated in two retreats to study and experience God's Word.

Despite the pandemic, the students and parents rose above the challenges and showed their deep dedication and commitment to Confirmation. Pastor Ryan, Peter Fredericksen and Cheryl Opper were the leaders and found it a true privilege and honor to be part of this year's Confirmands' journey. The leaders were impressed with the engagement, discussions and thoughtfulness of the students. In addition to studying the Old Testament and New Testament each student completed 10 worship forms where they explored different parts of the worship service and shared their thoughts, questions and insights.

On May 2, the students will participate in their "Acts of Kindness" class project where they will do yard clean-ups for some of our neighbors in need. We often talk in class about the importance of paying it forward for others. "Whatever you did for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

If you are able to contribute \$20, or whatever amount you'd like, BNB also accepts donations to help with transportation to these far away destinations. A container with 600 bikes and all kinds of parts that was just shipped earlier this month to Rwanda cost over \$8000.

Any monetary donation is tax deductible. But donating money in addition to donating bikes is entirely optional.

In the meantime, if you see bikes that people are giving away in front of their homes and you have a means of transporting them to your house, please do. If not, please let me know. 




Easter Scavenger Hunt
